COMPETITION TIME!

ell, here we are again with another season of competitions. The main Devon competions were begun by the new Novice competition held this year at Dunsford on 11 March 2000.

The next competition was the Devon 8 Bell at Ashburton on Saturday April 29th. Open to all affiliated towers with 8 bells or more, the competition consisting of rise, the peal of Queens and lower to be of not less than 20 minutes duration.

Six bell competition then began with the North and South Devon qualifiers taking place on Saturday 13th May 2000 at Ideford and Morchard Bishop respectively. The peal for these to be rise, peal of sixty on thirds and lower, duration to be minimum of fifteen minutes.

Major and minor finals were next on the list taking place at Churchstow and Zeal Monachorum on 27 May and 10 June respectively.

Results of all the above competitions can be found later in the newsletter.






Eight Bell 2000 (Top ringing)
